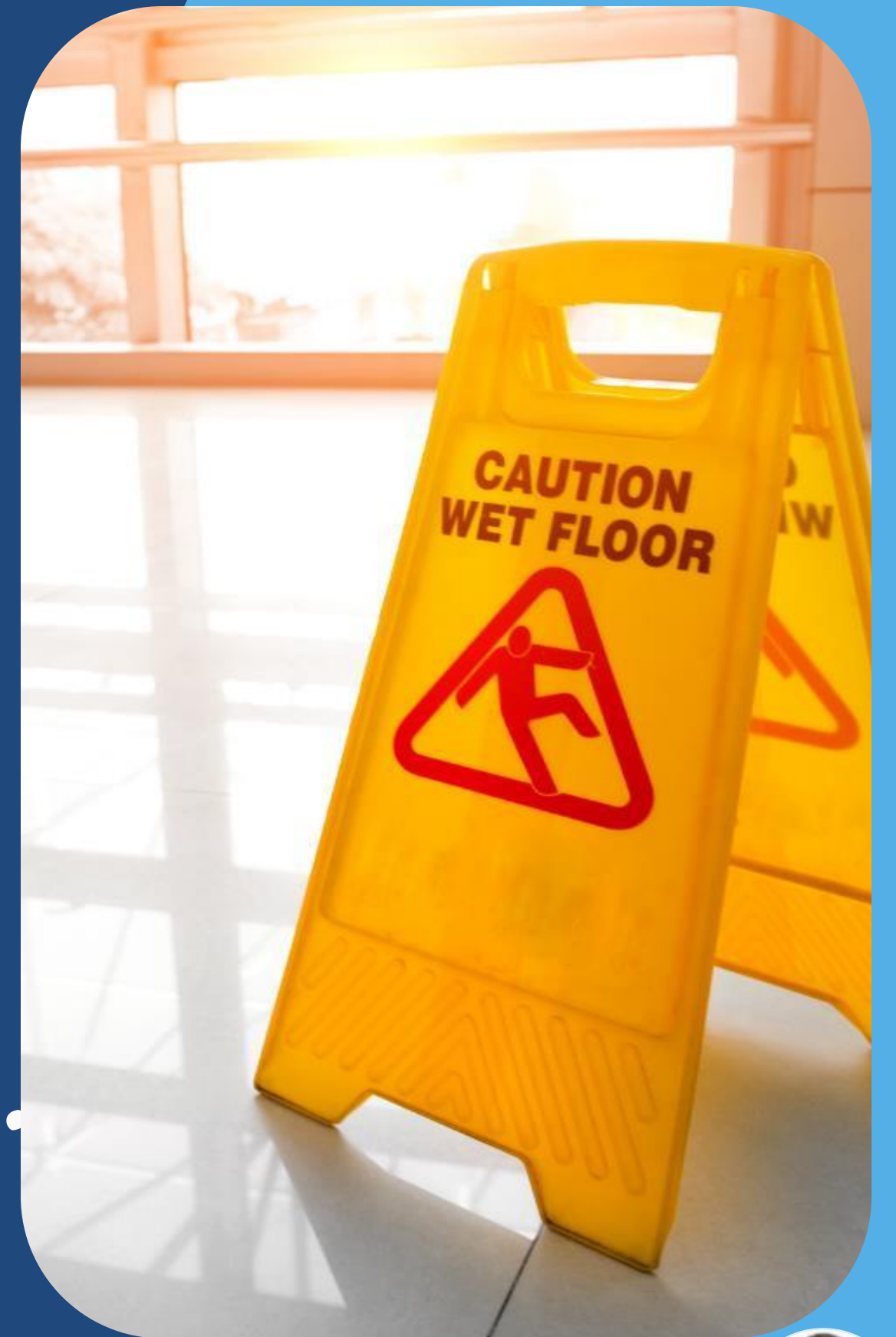

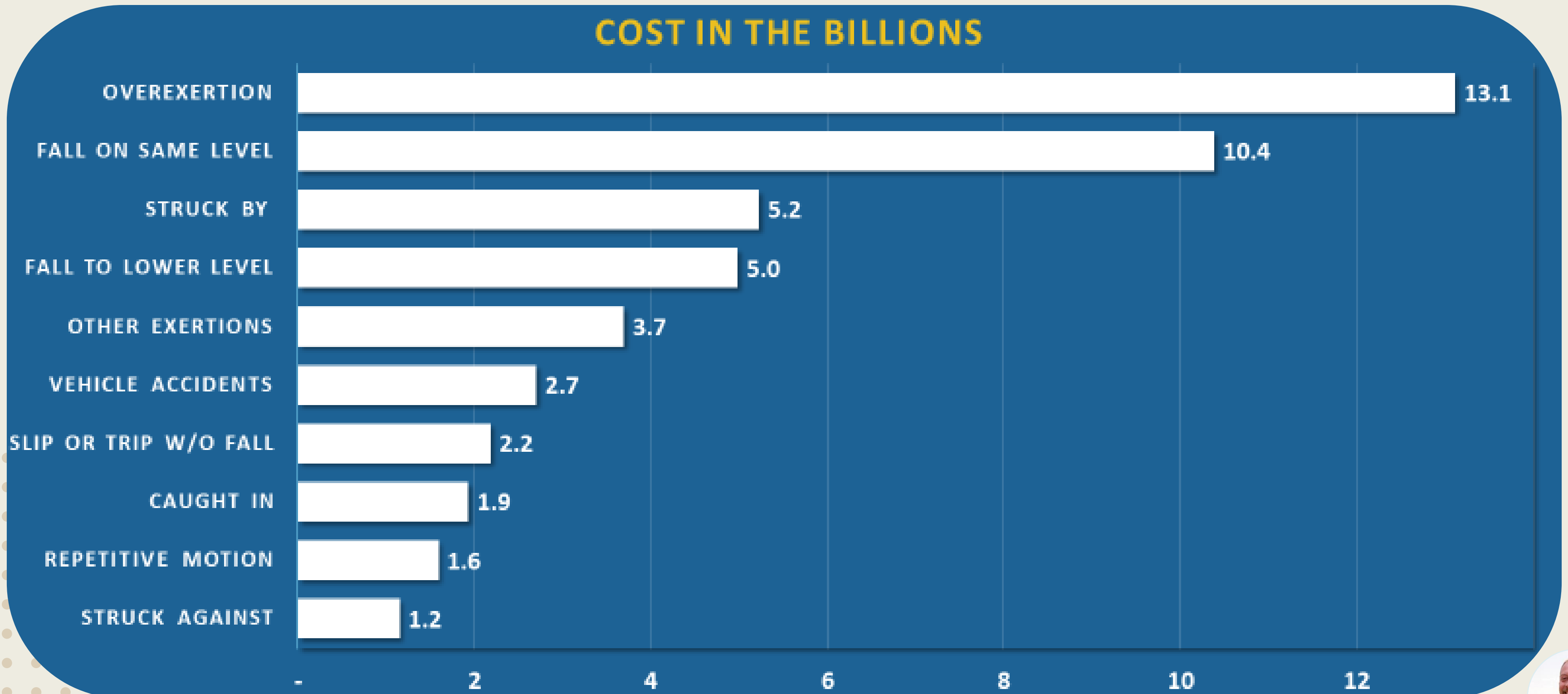

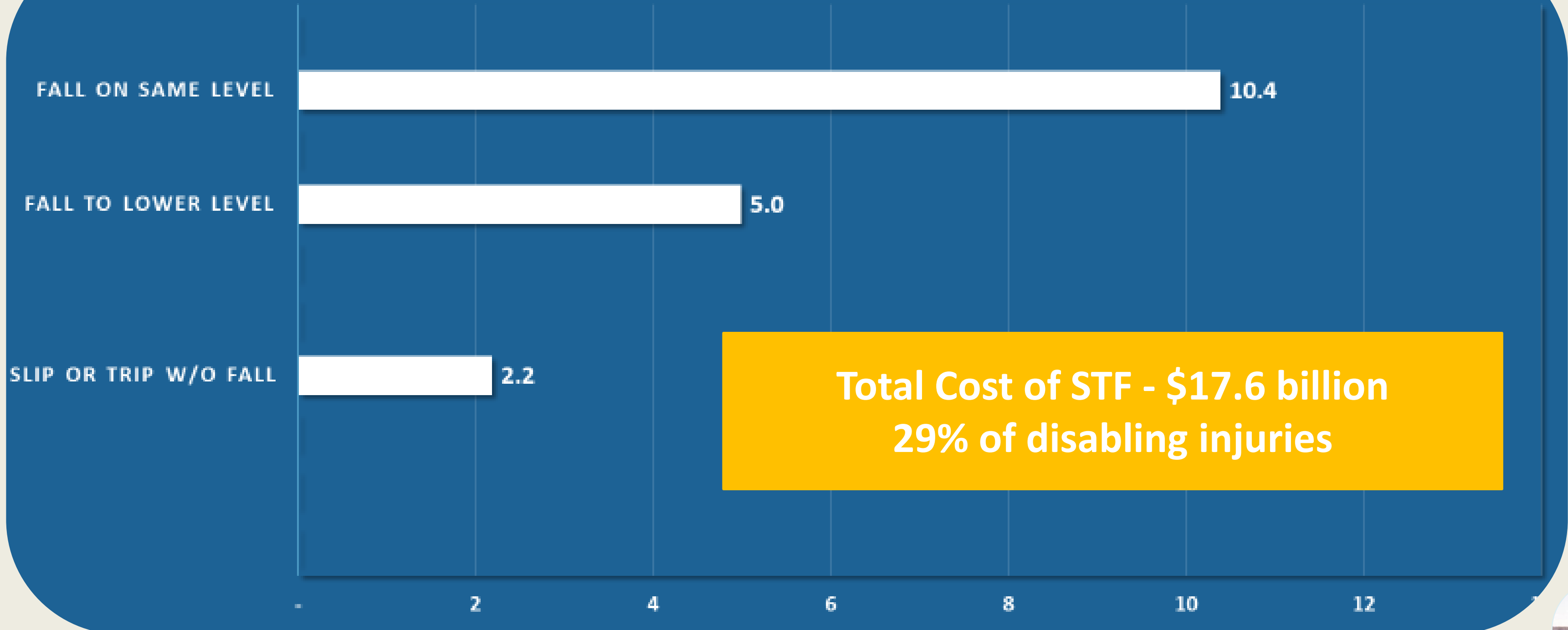

MEMIC Facility Slip, Trip and Fall Prevention Checklist

Instructions: Complete this checklist monthly.

	Exterior - Parking Lot & Sidewalk Areas	Y / N / NA	Self-Corrected	Maintenance Requested	Additional Assistance Needed
1	Parking area is cleared of ice/snow and salt has been applied to this area as warranted.				
2	Sidewalks are cleared of snow and ice, and salt/sand has been applied.				
3	Parking lot and sidewalks are free of large cracks, sunken or raised areas, holes, or debris.				
4	Inclines, handicapped ramps, and other changes in elevation on walkways are in good condition and free of obstructions.				
5	Curbs and/or wheel stops are provided where needed to protect pedestrians				
6	Exterior lighting is adequate (e.g., lights on, no broken or burned out lights)				
7	Drainage is adequate to avoid pooling of water.				
8	Plowing Contractor responds adequately and timely.				
9	Employees are aware of the importance of weather appropriate footwear and are reminded as applicable.				
Entry / Vestibule / Lobby					
10	Thresholds and stair coverings are secure and in good condition.				
11	Floor mats are located in appropriate places and are in good condition.				
12	Changes in floor elevation are clearly marked and transitions between any carpets and tile are smooth.				
13	Walking surfaces are in good condition and free of moisture, debris and other potential hazards.				
14	Wet conditions are addressed and "Wet Floor" signs are used while drying.				
15	Walkways are unobstructed.				
16	Doors are in good working condition and easy to open.				
17	Emergency exits and exit pathways are clear of objects.				
18	Camera System is properly positioned to ensure optimal coverage of this area.				
Interior Areas					
19	Aisles and workspaces are in good condition and free of clutter.				
20	All carpets are in good condition; free of rips, holes or wrinkles.				
21	Anti-fatigue mats are in place and in good condition.				
Restrooms / Utility Closets					
22	Walking surfaces are in good condition and free of moisture, debris and other hazards.				
23	Stalls, equipment, and fixtures are in good condition with no damage or defects.				
24	Step stools / ladders are used and stored properly.

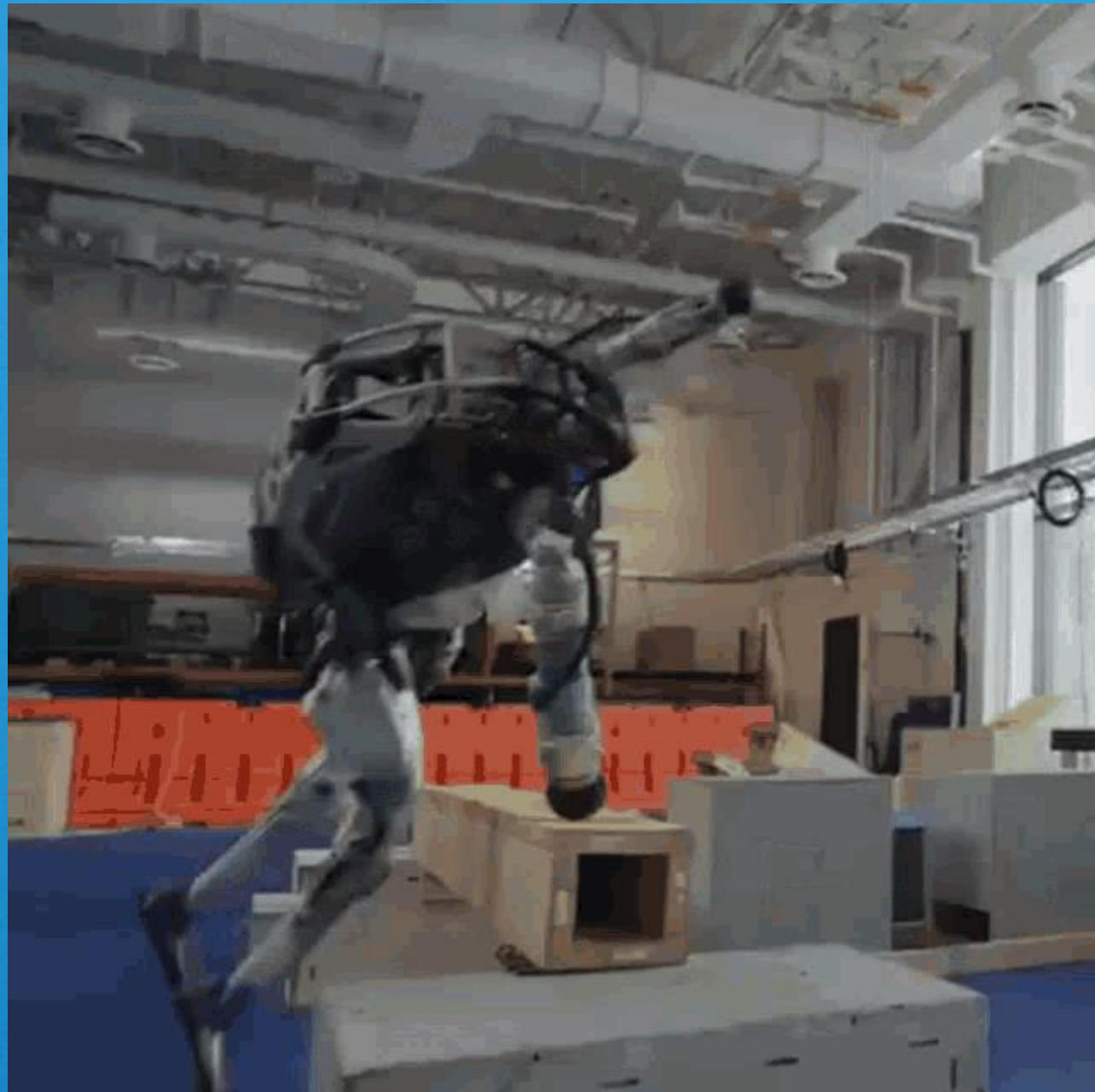

Is It Time to Replace Your Slip Resistant Shoes?

Food service workers are exposed to slip hazards on the job from worn shoe tread and grease, oil, and other spills in food preparation and dining areas.

45 slips, trips, and falls per day¹ **More than half** of these injuries were from slips²



As your shoes wear down, check them more often, check weekly. **Shoes with worn tread lead to more slips.**
